YOU PASSED THE QUESTIONNAIRE!

Once your initial application is approved, we will send you an FDA Prescreen and ask a few more questions. If qualified, we will send you for an AMH blood test at a LabCorp near you. If that result comes back in optimal range for egg donation, you will then work with a Nest Patient Navigator to set up your initial screening at one of our clinic locations.



History & Physical



Ultrasound

A provider from our clinic will perform a vaginal ultrasound of your ovaries to determine your folliclecount.

History & Physical

The history portion of the screening is a questionnaire meant to evaluate one's social behavior. We also evaluate medical history relating to any transmittable disease such as Syphilis, HIV, Hep B.

The physical portion of the screening will be completed by a nurse practitioner, who will assess for any active signs of transmittable diseases by checking for swollen lymph nodes, enlarged liver or spleen, etc.

Lab Work

We will also draw blood to ensure you are fit to donate. The labs that we will run with the blood sample include:

FDA Labs

Hep B, Hep C,Syphilis, HIV, HTLV, Chlamydia, Gonococcus, WestNile & Zika.

Donor Basic Screening

CBC, ABO/RH, chromosomeanalysis, & urine toxicity screen.

Genetic Testing

Psychological Consultation

We will refer you to a recommended third-party psychologist who will help assess that you are healthy to become an egg donor.

You can now become an eligible egg donor through Nest, and can begin the cycle process. This looks different for each donor and depends on your menstrual cycle and doctor's treatment plan. You will contact your Patient Navigator on Day 1 of your cycle and follow all instructions from there.

TREATMENT PLAN:

Priming

Baseline & Monitoring

Retrieval

Once all necessary pre-requisite items are complete, we can begin your cycle.

For most donors, the treatment plan is as follows:

Priming

You will "prime" your ovaries with birth control pills for around 2 weeks. This is to ensure all follicles are the same size when you begin stimulation medications to grow your ovaries.

Baseline Appointment

This appointment takes place 4 days after stopping your birth control. A transvaginal ultrasound is done to visualize your ovaries and ensure you're ready to begin stimulation medication. You will most likely begin the stimulation medication on this day. The stimulation medication is given in the form of daily self-injection for about 10-14 days.

1st Monitoring Appointment

While you are on stimulation medication, we will need you to come in for monitoring appointments to ensure everything is progressing well. The first monitoring appointment is done once you have been on 3 days of stimulation medications and is a blood draw to assess your hormone levels.

2nd Monitoring Appointment

The second monitoring appointment is a transvaginal ultrasound and blood draw to assess your hormone levels. This occurs once you have been on stimulation medication for 5 days.

More Monitoring Appointment

Additional monitoring appointments may be needed from stimulation days 6-13.

Retrieval

We generally retrieve eggs 12-15 days after beginning stimulation medication. For this procedure, you will be put under anesthesia and it takes around 30 minutes.

Is it safe?

Yes! The hormones show no increased risk of cancer.

Does it hurt?

While there is some discomfort associated, it is generally painless and safe.

Do I need to have a relationship with the intended parents or baby?

No, you will remain unidentified.
